LOCAL MARKET.

Wednesday, Feb. 7.
There was a fairly brisk demand for the 20 loads of hay that were offered. Sales were made at \$7.50 and \$8 per ton, mostly at the latter figure.
Oats sold at \$1.05 to \$1.07 per cwt. Only sold at the higher figure.
Straw was dull at \$5 and \$5.50 per ton.

WEEKLY REVIEW.

Owing to the cold weather the last six days, the markets held here were below the average. Consequently the amount of business transacted was comparatively small in comparison with the previous week. The demand in all lines was brisk. There was no material change in prices excepting for live hogs.

Grain.—The supply of oats about equals the demand. Prices are steady at \$1.04 to \$1.06, per cwt. Wheat is in more freely. Prices are unchanged at \$1.05 per bushel. Barley is in demand and is now selling at \$1.05 to \$1.06 per cwt. The dealers have received several carloads of corn, which are selling in wholesale lots at \$1.05 per cwt. This is no doubt the main reason for the drop in the price of barley.

Hay and Straw.—Compared with the previous week, the supply of hay has been larger. Sales are moderately brisk at \$7.50 per ton. Straw is very dull. Delivery was unusually large. Prices are easier at \$5 to \$5.50 per ton.

Meat and Eggs.—Butter is a trifle dear. Some of the large lots shipped by the country storekeepers were sold to the dealers at 15¢ and 20¢ for this and crocks. On this market, butter is selling at 15¢ to 16¢ per pound. The cold weather has decreased the supply of eggs. The dealers have stocks on hand, which has prevented prices from going much higher. Eggs are made at present at 20¢ per dozen for crate lots, and 22¢ for smaller lots.

Potatoes.—The cold weather has curtailed the supply. Prices are steady at \$6 to \$6.50 per bag.

Apples.—There is a fairly brisk demand for apples, especially the best grades, which sell at \$3 to \$3.50 per barrel. Inferior stock sells at 75¢ to \$1.10 per bag, or \$2 to \$2.50 per barrel.

Poultry.—The supply is fair, the demand is quite brisk. The following prices are most frequently paid: Turkey, dressed, 14¢ to 16¢ per pound; ducks, dressed, 10¢ to 12¢ per pound; chickens, dressed, 10¢ to 12¢ per pound; or 7¢ to 11¢ per pair; old fowl, 8¢ to 9¢ per pound, or 7¢ to 11¢ per pair.
Dressed Hogs.—Prices keep up well, considering that the price of live hogs is considerably lower; sales are made mostly at \$9 per cwt, quite a number sold at \$9.25 per cwt.

Live Hogs.—It was intimated in last week's market report of this paper that prices of live hogs would go considerably lower, and it was confirmed on Monday, when 40¢ per cwt. less was paid than on the previous Monday. A further decline is expected, as at Toronto they only sold \$6.50 per cwt. for select. Prices for next Monday's shipment has not as yet been declared. It will be about \$6.25 or \$6.50 per cwt. There is nothing doing in small pigs, as there has been only one lot offered during the past two weeks.

Honey.—Last season's output is pretty well sold out. What little is produced by the dealers is bought at 8¢ to 9¢ for strained, or 12¢ to 15¢ for honey in the comb.

Hides and Skins.—Hides have dropped half a cent per pound since last week.

Toronto, Feb. 6.—The prospects of a light run at the market today this morning helped to make trade pretty brisk, but as the morning advanced the market gradually held up to its early promise. Butchers were in most cases already fairly well supplied with cattle for present purposes, and were not disposed to face high prices, and an extremely low temperature at the same time. The result was that towards the close of the market, and notwithstanding the light run, there were several drovers and farmers with loads of cattle still on their hands. As these were not the pick of the offerings for the day, the market showed a tendency to ease off a little for the medium and common cattle. On the whole prices for good to choice butchers' cattle were firm, and the common cattle were a trifle easier. Stockers and Feeders' Market steady, but business not very active in these lines.
