WART MAY LEAD TO DREAD CANCER

Dr. Hill Skeptical of Mayo's Statement on Discovery Dealing With Disease.

When Dr. Charles H. Mayo of Rochester declares his belief in the theory that the Wasserman test may determine the presence of cancer, Dr. W. H. Hill, dean of the Institute of Public Health here, is inclined to be skeptical.

Speaking on cancer research at a leading surgeons at Philadelphia, Dr. Mayo is reported to have said: "I do not believe that cancer would be cured or that it would be preventable, but that it would be more amenable to treatment, and that is working would neither be so rapid nor so serious." He based this theory on the fact that the Wasserman test through which he claimed the presence of cancer may be detected.

Dr. Mayo said the Wasserman test must be confirmed, but that information from Berlin, where the test was announced, indicated it was practicable.

Startling Discovery. "If what Dr. Mayo says is true then it would be one of the most startling discoveries in the world of medical science," said the dean. "To begin with, scientists have not yet isolated the cancer organism.

The general state of cancer, and its treatment is much better than it was, while the individual case is much about the same.

Dr. Hill is in favor of an annual physical examination for everyone, because it would mean earlier diagnosis of cancer, as well as of other things.

"If we can get cancer in time we can do a great deal toward preventing it," he says. "If we get it in the earlier stages, we can absolutely prevent it by a local operation. On the other hand, when it reaches a certain stage and spreads to some of the organs, we cannot stop it. If cancer is once taken out in a local operation it cannot spread, and is ended.

Warts Are Cause. "Of course everything should be suspected of being the cause of cancer," he says. "You wouldn't think that a wart could contain much danger of cancer, but in a while a wart does turn to cancer. On general principles all warts should be removed. Even if a wart is removed a thousand warts, and only one of them had the beginnings of cancer, it would be worth while. A wart is not a beauty spot in any case.

"There is always a chance that any chronic ulcer may develop into cancer. It is always possible. Even if a wart is removed, it is only a way (to be sure) is to have an annual examination, provided you have a clever, intelligent and honorable doctor."
