CHICAGO, Oct. 28.—Presentation of evidence by the shippers who are opposing the proposed advance in freight rates was closed today before the Interstate Commerce Commission with the testimony of Gov. W. R. Stubbs of Kansas.

Gov. Stubbs declared his opposition to an increase in rates and his belief that the proper builder of railroads that valuations have been placed too high.
