ANOTHER TURBULENT ASSEMBLY  
IN TRAFALGAR SQUARE.

The Police Finally Gain the Ascendancy  
and Disperse the Mob Without Bloodshed—Many Arrests Made.

LONDON, Feb. 9.—In anticipation of another demonstration today, small crowds of roughs poured into Trafalgar square from different parts of the city. Few of the leaders, however, of yesterday's disturbances made their appearance.

Through it is well known that the leaders of yesterday's mob were arrested, the demonstrators proposed to send a petition to the home office demanding that they be afforded protection from the police.

Hyndman, president of the democratic federation, disclaims any responsibility for the actions of the mob. He declares that the trouble of various sections of the city is due to the distress existing among the working people.
