The barley market is now in a most peculiar position, and indeed the same may be said of the grain market in general. Farmers have been and are now forcing their grain on the market, in face of the fact that there was no steady demand, and as a result there is now so much more grain offering than the legitimate demand calls for that those who have grain to sell are obliged to conform to the prices of buyers, having no alternative, as others will sell at as low prices and it does not pay to store when some grain is put on the market,

Dairy produce is attracting some attention just now. Butter is being offered in large quantities, but only a small percentage finds sale at paying prices, owing to inferiority in guality. There is a live demand at good prices for all butter of high quality, and the rest is not wanted, so that in order to get it sold it has to be let go as low in some cases as 11 cents, and at prices ranging from that figure to 15 cents, while good butter will bring 19 to 20 and 21 cents with a ready sale, and gilt edge will bring 20 to 22 cents. The demand for the latter grade is steady.
