Upon reading the petition of Isiah Palmer and upwards of twenty others, praying for the alteration of the road around the Sand Hill, so called, on the Vashlet road, in Ward No. 1, it was ordered that the prayer thereof be granted, and a committee be appointed to inquire into the propriety and necessity of said alteration.

Upon reading the report of the Committee on Finance, it was ordered that the report of said committee be received and adopted.

Upon hearing read the report of the Committee on the Construction of Insane Asylums, it was ordered that said report be received and adopted.

The following is the report: To the Municipal Council now convened at the annual session of April, 1894.

GENTLEMEN—Your committee appointed and empowered to build an Insane Asylum at the annual session of April, 1894, report to report—

The full committee, with the exception of one, met at Bridgetown, May 2nd, 1894, to consider the building of a new, and having made a close study of the reports of the committee, and after due consideration, in view of question of economy, convenience, and upon the advice of the superintendent of the Halifax Hospital for the Insane, decided upon the site adapted.

The Council empowered us to construct a building and furnishing at a cost not to exceed \$50,000.

We decided to commence the construction of the building by day work and material, as we deemed expedient, from time to time, notwithstanding the fact that tenders had been received for its construction in amounts from \$5,000 to \$12,000.

In looking over plans and specifications, we decided that if any tender was received, we would have to provide for additional building material for a large sum. Furthermore, we would be at a disadvantage if we deemed changes in construction necessary after the contract had been made.

We have nearly completed a building, with general improvements, an outlay less than the lowest tender received. The building is now ready for occupancy.

Ordered, That Henry Frell be his statute labor on the public road upon which he resides.
