SHIPPING INTELLIGENCE.

The Empress of India is due from Yokohama Oct. 1.

The British ship Persian Empire, 1,532 tons, Capt. Hay, from Callao, arrived in Royal Roads Sept. 23 for orders.

The British ship Andreta was towed from Royal Roads Sept. 23 to Tacoma, to load wheat for the United Kingdom.

The British bark Bankburn, on the way from Taltal to Royal Roads, has been chartered to load lumber at Port Blakely.

BANK OF ENGLAND FIGURES.

A report published by the Bank of Fugland shows that on January 2nd last the amount of dividends "due and not demanded" was over £1,700,000. The number of stockholders is now nearly 250000, and during the discussions on Mr. Goschen's great conversion scheme it was stated that unclaimed funds were credited to some 10,900 accounts, which included more than 40 holdings of over 1 0,000 each.
