Dr. Boyd: I have a small sheet here concerning my former testimony. It is an errata sheet dealing with some minor items.

The CHAIRMAN: I take it we may incorporate this as an appendix, to straighten out that evidence.

Some Hon. Members: Agreed.

Mr. Best: Is it our understanding that Dr. MacKenzie is not going to comment further on this matter?

The CHAIRMAN: I would not think it would be fair to Dr. Mackenzie to ask him to comment. Before you go, what about Mr. Drysdale's suggestion?

Mr. AIKEN: Scrap it.

Mr. DRYSDALE: I suggest a letter as a minimum.

Mr. AIKEN: I do not think a letter would do.

The CHAIRMAN: I am now in the hands of the committee.

Mr. DRYSDALE: If you want the inspector called—

Mr. AIKEN: Do no more or less. Call the inspector.

Mr. DRYSDALE: I suggest you call the inspector.

The CHAIRMAN: What is the wish of the committee? I am only the chairman.

Mr. AIKEN: I am opposed to it.

Mr. DRYSDALE: I have suggested a method whereby we can get this information. Either the safety factor is important, or it is not. If it is unimportant, let us drop it. I think it is important.

The CHAIRMAN: Unfortunately, we have just lost our quorum.
