CANADIAN CONTRIBUTION TO UNITED STATES PROGRAM

Mr. Ted Schellenberg (Nanaimo-Alberni): Mr. Speaker, my question is directed to the Minister of State for Science and Technology. All Canadians were touched by yesterday's tragic event over the skies of Florida. Can the Minister assure the House that Canada will continue its valuable contribution to the American space program despite the recent tragic event?

Hon. Frank Oberle (Minister of State for Science and Technology): Mr. Speaker, I thank the Hon. Member for his question. It gives me the opportunity to express my personal regret at the events of yesterday.

There will be no interruption in terms of Canada's ongoing space programs. Many new efforts which the Government may wish to initiate into new space adventures are in a very preliminary evaluation and planning stage and I see no interruption in that effort.

SOUTHWESTERN ONTARIO'S WATER SUPPLY

Mr. Howard McCurdy (Windsor-Walkerville): Mr. Speaker, my question is directed to the Minister of the Environment. Yesterday's Ontario Government's report showed, through the use of independent monitoring, what previous Government tests had not. Not only do residents of southwestern Ontario face the threat of inundation by dioxin-containing flood waters but they are drinking dioxin-containing waters right now.

When will the Minister announce his promised program for the control of chemical contaminants of the environment? Will the plan include a national safe drinking water act, and an emergency initiative to produce a federal-provincial program to improve the purification of water systems in municipalities, including the use of activated carbon filters?

Hon. Tom McMillan (Minister of the Environment): Mr. Speaker, the short answer is that we will be introducing a new Environmental Contaminants Act that will address all the concerns that the Hon. Member raised which are within federal jurisdiction. Some of them, of course, are within provincial and municipal jurisdictions.

I should caution the Member, however, that even though we are very concerned, as is the Ontario Government, he should put this matter into perspective. It is not a matter of finding something in the water that was not there before. It is a matter, instead, of science reaching the point where it can detect certain things that could not be detected before. In fact, if one were to express the quantity of the substance found in terms of time instead of weight, it would be equivalent to one second in 32 centuries. In short, it is minute, it is sporadic, and it is not harmful.
