

Order in Council P.C. 2209, approved April 29, 1949: recommending that a Proclamation do issue bearing date the 30th day of April, 1949, calling such new Parliament together and directing the issue of writs of election for a general election of persons to serve as members in the House of Commons; such writs of election to be dated the 30th day of April, 1949, fixing the 27th day of June, 1949, as polling day at the said elections; said writs to be returnable on the 25th day of August, 1949.

And further recommends that a further Proclamation do issue, dated the 30th day of April, 1949, summoning Parliament to meet on Thursday, the 1st day of September, 1949, at the City of Ottawa.

By leave of the House, Mr. Robinson (Simcoe East), moved that Mr. Speaker do now leave the Chair for the House to go into Committee of the Whole on Private Bills; which was agreed to.

The following Bills were then considered in Committee of the whole, reported without amendment, read the third time and passed, viz:—

Bill No. 241 (Letter E-8 of the Senate), intituled: "An Act to incorporate Trans-Northern Pipe Line Company".

Bill No. 242 (Letter F-8 of the Senate), intituled: "An Act to incorporate The British American Pipe Line Company.

Bill No. 243 (Letter G-8 of the Senate), intituled: "An Act to incorporate Western Pipe Lines".

A Message was received from the Senate informing this House that the Senate had passed the following Bill:—

Bill No. 248, An Act for granting to His Majesty certain sums of money for the public service of the financial year ending the 31st March, 1950.

A Message was received from the Right Honourable Thibaudeau Rinfret, acting as Deputy of His Excellency the Governor General, desiring the immediate attendance of the House in the Senate Chamber.

Accordingly Mr. Speaker, with the House, went to the Senate Chamber; when His Honour the Deputy Governor General was pleased to give, in His Majesty's name, the Royal Assent to the following Bills:—
