Clerical and expert assistance has been provided to analyse, collate and prepare a report in respect of taxing statutes and other jurisdictions, evidence and briefs.

Your Committee recommends:—

That immediately the Senate reassembles a Special Committee be appointed to examine into the provisions and workings of the Income War Tax Act and The Excess Profits Tax Act, 1940, with powers similar to those granted this session and, as far as is practicable, comprising the same Senators.

The said Report was adopted.

The Honourable Senator Beauregard, from the Standing Committee on Banking and Commerce, to whom was referred the Bill (240), intituled: "An Act to provide Rehabilitation Allowances for Veterans", reported that they had gone through the said Bill, and had directed him to report the same to the Senate with an amendment, which he was ready to submit whenever the Senate would be pleased to receive the same.

The said amendment was concurred in.

The said Bill, as amended, was then read the third time.

The question was put whether this Bill, as amended, shall pass.

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill with an amendment, to which they desire their concurrence.

The Honourable Senator Beauregard, from the Standing Committee on Banking and Commerce, to whom was referred the Bill (233), intituled: "An Act to amend The Veterans' Land Act, 1942", reported that they had gone through the said Bill, and had directed him to report the same to the Senate, without any amendment.

The said Bill was then read the third time. The question was put whether this Bill shall pass.

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That a Message be sent to the House of Commons to acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill, without any amendment.
