Funds should also be available which would enable our Graduate students to visit the libraries of other institutions, when necessary, for their research.

SUMMARY OF REQUIREMENTS

CLASSICS
Economics

Increased Staff, Increased Libravy grant, Fellowships
An opportunity for more personal help and supervision of students, enatiling ultimately increased staff.

ENGLISH

More assistants to deal with junior years: increased Library grant: Funds for research purposes: Fellowships. Doubled Staff. A sum of \$10,000 to fill Libravy gaps and double the regular annual grant: Fellowships. Increased Staff.

HISTORY

One further member on staff: special library funds when needed. Fellowships and scholarships.

MATHEMATICS
PHILOSOPHY

Doubled staff: \$1,000 a year for Laboratory equipment (\$2,000 if Nursery school is included): \$300 a year extra Library grant: Salary increases, and Fellowships.

Psychology

Increased Staff: Increases Library grant.
One new professor: a further suite of rooms: \$500 a year for research equipment: \$2,000 a year for collection of Social Facts. One scholarship and

two Fellowships. It will be observed that the requirements of the Departments of Sociology and Psychology are the most considerable.

MISCELLANEOUS

The Department of Economics pleads the necessity for some form of subsidy for the printing of its publications, and also urges the desirability of producing an Economic Quarterly Journal. The Department of Mathematics points out that, while few students specialise in Mathematics in their Graduate course the Department is called in to the assistance of students in Physics. One Department^x complains that it is difficult to proceed with regular teaching work, if it is constantly interrupted by Committee Meetings and calls for reports. (The writer of the summary has so far been compelled to cancel six lectures for this reason). The History Dept. urges that the M.A. degree should be controlled by the Faculty of Arts and that the Department should not be under the jurisdiction of two faculties.
