Dear Sir Arthur:-

The Executive Committee has asked me to request that you write to His Excellency Lord Willingdon as Visitor and invite him to be the guest of the McGill Debating Union Society on the evening of the celebration of its Fiftieth Anniversary, namely, the 31st of March, and to attend a small dinner which would be given before the proceedings began.

It is proposed to have a Mock Parliament which would debate the following resolution: Resolved that this House favours the representation of the Universities in the Canadian House of Commons."
