I have been told, and sometimes in the same breath, that such teaching as is contained in the present tract is *apostolic but dangerous*, a contradiction that needs no answer; be careful to be apostolic, and we cannot be dangerous; or, to quote the words of Dr. Fuller, present Bishop of Niagara, "If anything deserves to be called folly and madness, it is the preferring human inventions to the wisdom which comes from above." (Sermon : Religious Excitement tried by Scripture.)

And my prayer is, that those who read this may be helped thereby to exclaim, (if feebly,) "And the life which I now live in the flesh, I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me."
