

THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL N^o.

An Act for the relief of Adella Alice McNeil Slobosky.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Adella Alice McNeil Slobosky, residing at the city of Montreal, in the province of Quebec, sales-lady, wife of Maurice Slobosky, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the said city, has by her petition alleged that they were married on the twentieth day of August, A.D. 1949, at the city of Verdun, in the said province, she then being Adella Alice McNeil, a spinster; and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, because of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved.

1. The said marriage between Adella Alice McNeil and Maurice Slobosky, her husband, is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

Right to marry again.

2. The said Adella Alice McNeil may at any time hereafter marry any man whom she might lawfully marry if the said marriage with the said Maurice Slobosky had not been solemnized.
