Chas. A. Schofield, dealer in millinery, Winnipeg, is giviag up business.
E. NicoL, general storekeeper, Desford, Man., will remove to Cherry Crcek.
T. C. Gray, grocer, Morden, has changed the siyle of his house to Gray \& Co.
Tas. Barr, of Maniton, has opened a general store ât tine cud of tho Manitoka Southwestern.

The Manitoba Cattlo Co., of Westboume, will apply for le.ters patent of incorporaiion.
G. T. Londr, hotelkcoper and livery stables, Morden, has leased bis live:y business to Geo. George.
J. M. Tracr, of Pert Arthur, has not sold ont his hotel business in that place, as has bsen reported.

Tire aunual mecting of the Winnipeg Board of Trade will take place on Tuesday neat. With the usual reports, one on the city's trade for 1585 will be piesented by the Secretary.
Tue Troule Bulletin is the name of a new weekly financial and commercial paper, published by H. Mason of Montreal. The first issue contains a rery full review of the different branches of trade, and sditorial matter on truly commercial subjects.

At a meeting held under the auspices of the Portage la Prairie Agricultural Sociosy, a motion was carried favoring the introduction of some varicty of wheat carlier than red fyfe. No particula: variety was specified, and the matter was left with th:e directors of the socicty, who will decide as to what new kinds of wheat shall be tested.

Is the case of the Union Bank vs. Bulmer, which cane up before the Clief Justice on Monday last, His Lordsbip entered P. verdict for the plaintiffs in the sum of $\$ 3,514$. "The defendunts have the right to move in full conrt for a reduction of interest. The perticulars of this interesting caso are as follows:-The plaintiffs sue upon a prommiesory note made by the defendant for $£ 3,000$, under tho firm name of F. T. Bulmer \& Co. The note was made for the accomodation of the Northwast Lumber Co. The defence set ep by Henry Bulmer, one of the defendants, is that the note in question was made by his co-defendant and late partner withont his linowledgo or assent for the aecommodation of the Northwest Iumbering Company, and that the nlaintiffs discounted it knowing thet it was an accommodation note, and therefore that it was not a note made for the partnership of F. F. Bulmer \& Co. The cadorsement is in the namu of the Northwest Lumber Company. The defence upon this ground is that the note was not endorsed.
