

*Indians*, and *French*, and upon my Journey, twelve Months and twenty-six Days.

But my dear Husband could not enjoy himself with Satisfaction, our eldest Daughter being yet in the Hands of the *Indians*; he therefore began a Second Journey, about the 19th of the second Month 1727, in Order to redeem her, in Company with a Kinman and his Wife, who went to redeem some of their Children, and were successful to their Desire; but my dear Husband died in the Woods, about half Way between *Albany* and *Canada*, in my Kinsman's Arms.

N. B. The Substance of the foregoing Account was taken from her own Mouth by *Samuel Bowmas*. And, in the seventh Month, called *September*, 1741, *Samuel Hopwood* was with her, and received the Relation much to the same Purpose; at which Time he saw the Child (then grown a young Woman) who was sucking at her Breast when she was carried into Captivity.
