The rest of my fellow sufferers in the shipwreck soon after arrived at Hallifax in a shallop from Spanish River. The captain, conscious of the reception he would meet with, did not think proper to go to his owner at New York, to give an account of the loss of his vessel; but took his passage in a ship from Hallifax to London, and now serves as a pilot in the river Thames. The mate was, on account of his good conduct during the whole of our transactions, appointed by a gentleman in Hallifax to the command of a ship bound to the West Indies.
