Albania Neutral. PARIS, Sept. 30.-Ismail Kemal, Albani-an member of the Turkish Parliament, in a telegraphic despatch to The Paris Temps to-day, says that Italy has not sent one soldler into Albania. On the contrary, Italy has kept every Albanian under strict observations. The Albanians, Ismail Kemal says, who have been during so many centuries the faithful detenders of the empire, will have no relations with a foreign power incon-sistent with their fidenty to the Turkish Empire. This is the time for all nation-alities within the empire to united upon their common rights.


Italians Peaceable. CHIASSO, Oct. L.-In a circular note, sent by the government to the Italian consuls in Octoman territory, instructions were given to urge Italian subjects to maintain peace and not resist if their places of business are closed. Some of the consuls have answered that the col-omies are maintaining an admirable atti-tude, notwithstanding such incidents as have occurred at Saloniki and in Syria.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Sept. 30.-A spe-cial decree issued this afternoon formaliy appoints Said Pasha as grand vizier. The cabinet has not been formed. Said Pasha will probably also assume the portfolio of foreign affairs, as the aftort to enlist Kiamil Pasha appears to have failed. It is believed that the life of the new min-istry will be short.

Ten Thousand From Canada. MONTREAL, Sept. 30.-C. Mariotti, sct-ing general consul in Montreal for Itasy, stated this afternoon that if the war situ-ation with Turkey assumed an aspect of much bloodahed, there would be at least 10,000 Italians in Canada who would be ready to fight the Turks. There are alto-gether about 60,000 Italians, men, women and children, in the Dominion, and in his opinion the eligible men would all stand and help Italy in the fight for Tripoli.
