New York, Nov. 24.—From a field of 42 cortestants, Wm. J. Hale of Yale won the individual championship of the Intercollegiate Cross Country Association of Amateur Athletes of America, over the Travers Island course to-day.

The team championship honors went to Correll, four of her seven representatives fluishing in the first 12, with a point score of 29. Harvard was second with 35, Yale third with 37, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Boston, fourth with 65, University of Pennsylvania fifth with 70, Columbia sixth with 85, and Princeton in last place with 111 points.

This was the seventh annual meet of this association and the team honors were won by Cornell for the sixth time, Yale having won both the individual and team honors in 1901.


