NASHVILLE. Tenn., Jan. 1.—The convention of Bible students which opened here was addressed by Pastor Reset of Brooklyn, N.Y. He had a deeply interested and attentive audi-ence, baking for his text the message of the angels to the shepherds of Beth-lehem, "Behold, I bring you good t'd-lehem, "Behold, I bring you good t'd-tares and it has provided for the relief of our text, that ultimately great joy should come to all people thru Messiah's sacrifice. But would it be just to lay the pen-alty of Adam's sin upon a substitute? Would it be just to cause the innocent of the angels to the shepherds of Beth-lehem, "Behold, I bring you good t'd-ings of great joy, which shall be to all people; for unto you is born this day in the City of Bethlehem a Saviour, which is Grant joy to all people? Of the present the poet has truthfu'ly said.

"Now the world is full of suffering, Sounds of wee fall on my ears. Sights of wretchedness and sorrow Fill my eyes with pitying tears. 'Tis the earth's dark night of weep-Wrong and evil triumph now; can wait, for just before me Beams the morning's reseate glow."

This is in full agreement with the prophetic declaration, "Weeping may endure, for a n'ght, but joy cometh in the morning." (Psa, xxx., 5.) The question is not as respects the weeping and the night, the reign of darkness, of sin, of death. That is fact-not imagina-tion, not speculation. Even those most favorably situated share with the world in general the condition which the apostle describes, saying, "The whole creation groaneth and travalleth in pain-together \* \* \* waiting for the manifestation of the sons of God" -(Rom. vili., 22-19)--waiting for the rning of the new and better day referred to by the angels and by all the prophets and apostles, as well as by our Redeemer. What interests us in this connection is the promised escape rom present conditions to those of joy. happiness and blessing. Whoever car hearfily believe the angelic message will surely agree that it is good tidings --a message of peace on earth and good will to men. But show us how it can be brought about, and when. Prove the matter to us, not only Scripturally but demonstrate it logically, for it is contrary to all that we have ever been taught, or ever believed, and it seems too good to be true.

In order to appreciate the Bible explanation of how the relief and joy are coming to the world, we must note these declarations respecting the cause and source of our tribulations. Noroly summed up as in the Apostle Paul's statement, "By one man's dis-obscience sin entered into the world, and death as the result of sin; and so passed upon all men, for that all have sinned." 



Postmasters in Britain Commence the Task\_500,000 Eligibles. LONDON, Jan. 1.-Postmasters thru out the United Kingdom have com-menced the payment of old age pensions under the act of the last session of parliament to persons over seventy

years of age. Seven hundred thousand applications which 200,000 were disallowed, chiefly because the applicants have been in receipt of poor relief. It is estimated that the old age pen-

sions will cost the country \$35,000,000 annually. The highest pension is five \$105 a year. If their income exceeds \$105 but is less than \$155 small amounts will be paid.
