Smith an International League
Sherrod Smith, young left-hander who
gave the Red Sox a stout argument, is a
graduate of the International League. He
was with Newark two years ago when
that club was a "farm" for Brooklyn,
and along with Myers, who also starred
at Boston, was saved from the wreck
when the Federals broke into Indian
territory. Always a high class performer,
Smith's line showing against the
world's champions was no surprise to his
friends. Former players in Barrow's
circuit figured largely in that contest.

which Toronto is a member in addition
to the Brooklyn stars named Olson, the
Dodgers' shortstop, is an infielder who
was turned down by Manager Birmingham

and is a veteran.

Would Buy the Brooklyn Club

James E. Gaffney, former owner of the
Boston National League club, announced
on Wednesday that he would purchase
the Brooklyn club if Charles H. Ebbets,
who has indicated his willingness to sell,
would name a "reasonable" figure. He
conferred with Mr. Ebbets before the
game on Wednesday and after the con-
ference it was said that the negotiations
would be resumed upon the completion
of the series.

Another prospective purchaser is Char-
les L. Feltman, a Coney Island restau-
rant proprietor. Feltman said that he
had talked the situation over with Mr.
Ebbets but that nothing definite had
been done.

Riley Let Go.

"Eddie" Riley, who has been with the
Red Sox twelve years, the last three as
secretary of the club, has been dropped
by President Lannin.

Sick in bed, the news came as a shock
to Mr. Riley, but he gave no rea-
son for his sudden discharge. "You will
have to ask Mr. Lannin for the reason,"
was his only comment. A week ago sev-
eral other employees of the club were
discharged.

HOCKEY.

Harvey Pulford is the latest suggested
as president of the National Hockey
Association. One of the managers of
an N. H. A. club has suggested his name
and it has met with the approval of
some of the other clubs. Harvey Pul-
ford is one of the best all-round sporting
men in Canada, and is well fitted for the

position. He has played hockey, being
a member of the famous Ottawa Club
who held the Stanley cup for so many
seasons. He also played with the Ot-
tawa Rough Riders when they won
rugby championship, and is a well
known cricketer. He has competed in
almost every division of sport, and for
several seasons has been looked on as
one of the most popular referees in the
N. H. A. In selecting Harvey Pulford
as president, the club affiliated with
the N. H. A. could hardly make a mis-
take, as he, through his experience as
a player and referee, would hold the men
in control at all times.

Champion to Wear Khaki.

Another athletic champion joined the
244th, Kitchener's Own, this week,
when James Adams, who held the west-
ling championship for the Pacific coast
in 1912, and also held the light heavy-
weight boxing championship, joined the
battalion. Adams is a man of five feet
eleven inches, and weighs around 180
pounds. He has a good ring record. He
served five years in the U. S. army, in-
cluding two years in the Philippines,
and also put in a year on the U. S. S.
California during the Nicaragua diffi-
culty.

Ertle and Lynch Fight a Draw.

Joe Lynch of the White Sox, held
Johnny Ertle, the bantamweight cham-
pion, to a draw in a furious ten-round
boxing contest at the Pioneer Sporting
Club, New York, on Thursday night.
Ertle got off to a fast start and piled
up a lead in the first two rounds. Lynch,
however, came back and by waging a
cyclonic two-fisted fight overhauled his
opponent and went into the lead on
points.

Knocked Out in Two Rounds.

Jack Dillon, Hoosier slugger, knocked
out Sailor Grande in the second round
of their scheduled ten-round bout at the
Broadway Sporting Club, New York, on
Tuesday. A right uppercut delivered as
the men were emerging from a close in-
terchange sent Grande into slumberland.
There was little fighting in the first
round, both men devoting their energy
toward feeling each other out. Dillon
got the range early in the second round
and whipped over his jaw crusher after
a minute of sparring.
