

TESTING AUTHORITY OF INSPECTORS UNDER THE N.B.P.A.

Arises From Attempt to
Seize Beer at Moncton
Freight Shed

CHARGES AGAINST TWO C.N.R. OFFICIALS

Evidence Taken and Cases
Adjourned to Monday
and Tuesday

MONCTON, Aug. 20.—The enforcement of the New Brunswick prohibition law, and the extent of the inspectors' authority under the act towards the suppression of illegal importation of Quebec beer to the province was tested out in the Moncton police court before Judge MacDougall today, when H. B. Ayer, local freight agent of the C. N. R., and Charles Cole, freight shed employee, appeared before the judge to answer to charges, in the first case of obstructing or attempting to obstruct an officer making a search on the C. N. R. premises and, in the second case, with obstructing a peace officer in the execution of his duties.

The first charge was referred under the terms of the N. B. Prohibition Act against Mr. Ayer, while the second charge was made under the criminal code against Mr. Cole.

ADJOURNMENTS MADE
Both cases were proceeded with and after hearing the evidence of Prohibition Inspectors Bourgeois and Keizer in both instances, adjournment was made by the magistrate until Monday.

REFERRED TO ATTY-GEN'L.

At the outset of the cases Regional Solicitor T. J. Allen asked for an adjournment as Hon. I. C. Rand, regional counsel of the railways, had addressed a telegraphic communication to Hon. Dr. Baxter, attorney-general of the province, in regard to the case of obstruction to adjournment was taken by the crown counsel, C. F. Gregory Bridges, which was sustained by the judge and the cases proceeded.

THE EVIDENCE

In the case against Freight Agent Ayer, the first witness was Inspector Joseph J. Bourgeois. He told the court of going to the C. N. R. freight sheds in search of illegal shipments of Quebec ale along with two other inspectors, and discovering eight cases of what they believed to be Quebec beer. They were ordered out of the freight shed by Mr. Cole, witness continued, and Inspector Keizer went to secure a search warrant, which was produced to Freight Agent Ayer, who said to them the warrant was no good. But the officers continued going into the freight shed and there they encountered more opposition when attempting to make the search, Inspector Bourgeois informing the court that Mr. Ayer took him by the coat to show him to the door. The cases of alleged ale were, however, taken for re-billing to Fredericton, but they had, in the interval until the procuring of the search warrant by Inspector Keizer, been taken by railway handlers and locked in the bond room.

"BOOTLEGGER'S HOME"

In answer to a query as to how many doors were in this room, witness said there were two, one marked (Bond Room) and the other "Home of the Bootleggers."

Inspector Keizer corroborated the previous witness' evidence, after which the case was adjourned until Monday.

SECOND CASE.

In the case against Charles Cole, Inspector Keizer told of the happenings when he went to the freight shed. Superintendent Tingley of the C. N. R. police had told him to pay the freight charges and take the beer which was all that was necessary. Freight Agent Ayer refused the offer of the money for the transportation charges. Witness then said he would seize the beer and after placing one case aboard a truck Cole came in, put his arm against witness' face and pushed him to one side, at the same time giving orders to the freight handlers to remove the cases and stand in between Keizer and the shipment, while the eight cases were removed to the bond room. He swore all cases contained intoxicating liquor.

Defence Counsel Allen asked for a dismissal of the case on the grounds of the C. N. R. being crown property, but Mr. Bridges contended that the National Railways Act, of 1919, made the railways a corporate body and



placed them in the same position as a limited company.

The judge upheld the Crown attorney's stand and refused dismissal, adjourning the case until Tuesday next.

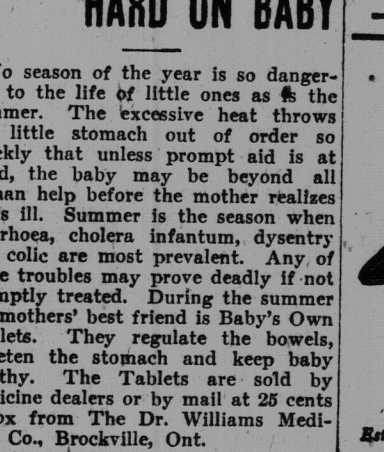
DR. WEEKS IN MONCTON.

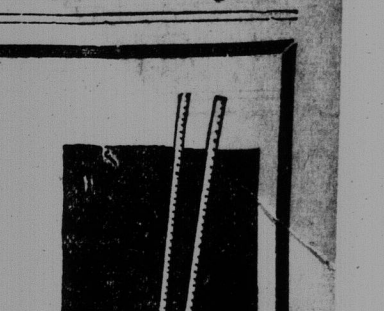
