

COUNCIL DECIDES TO PAVE SEELEY STREET UNDER ABUTTORS PLAN

Price Waterhouse Report Will be Presented to Council Monday.

The City Council this morning decided to proceed with the paving of Seeley street, under the Local Improvement Act, to have the city solicitor appear before the Public Utilities Commission in connection with the alleged discrimination in gas rates of the New Brunswick Power Company, and passed an amendment to the tax by-law.

A delegation from the meat dealers' association appeared to ask why their request for an early closing by-law had not been completed. The petition had been signed by more than 75 per cent of the meat dealers in the city and they would like to have the law passed.

Mayor Potts said that no signature from firms in the market on the North End would be considered in the petition as the former had their hours regulated by the market hours and the latter did not pay any license fee. The matter of peddling was referred to the council.

On motion of Commissioner Frink it was decided to notify Hon. John A. Barry, judge of the county court, that he was by virtue of his office, one of the trustees of the Tucker Park.

Commissioner Frink reported that the estimated cost of the sidewalk and paving of Seeley street was \$2,483, made up as follows: Sidewalk, \$2,483; curbing, \$1,272; asphalt street surface, \$5,997; grass plot, \$201; incidentals, \$850; and he moved the work be undertaken under the Local Improvement Act, under which the abuttors pay one-half of the cost.

London, Sept. 11.—Lloyd George made a most important declaration of the Anglo-Russian treaty in a speech at Penryn, Wales, last night. The former Premier declared that the treaty was a fake and folly which had been hastily patched up and made of the recent session of Parliament because Premier MacDonald has been held up by the Socialist government of his own party.
