FEAR TOUGH GRAIN

More Activity in Trade Reported and Prices Better-

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B. C. Fruit Outlook.

Winnipeg, Man., Oct. 15.—With threshing completely tied up on account of heavy rains, and snowfall covering considerable territory in Saskatchewan and Alberta, harvesting operations were practically at a standstill the past week, according to the weekly crop reports of the agricultural department of the Canadian Pacific Railway.

Parts of western Saskatchewan and Northern Alberta were able to get in one or two days' work with the machines, but conditions were unfavorable. Little or no sprouting has been reported to date, but considerable tough grain may be expected. Harvesters are discouraged on account of so much lost time, and a considerable number have returned east. The farmers complain that in the majority of cases men refuse to do their work while the grain is drying out.

Very little fall ploughing has been done. Livestock receipts fell off considerably during the week. More activity in trade was reported with slightly better prices. Outside markets are also showing more life, and a considerable number of inquiries from eastern points for western feeder cattle have been received.


