(Sussex Record.) As a result of the two meetings held in Sussex in the interests of Public Health, it has been decided to apply to the Dept. of Health to have Miss Marion Smith continue the work in this centre for the next three months.

Many Matters Before Hydro Commission

Yesterday afternoon at a meeting of the Civic Power Commission it was announced that work on the erection of the stanchion for the prominent street lighting system would be commenced on Monday morning.

The Canadian General Electric Co., Ltd., contractors for the outdoor switching equipment, had advised that shipment had been made of the bulk of the material and erection would be begun on its arrival.

The action of the Common Council in turning down a recommendation of the commission regarding the purchase of poles from Lindsay Bros., Montreal, and calling for tenders, occasioned some criticism by the commission members. It was pointed out that the original Lindsay tender was accepted to fulfill all the requirements of poles by the commission and that on three different occasions the council had accepted a recommendation to purchase poles.

A bill from the city for \$118.50 for repairs to the main street water meter, was paid. The secretary reported that bills for material and labor for the month, amounting to \$25,086, had been paid.
