Light and Sunshine.  
The words on the ground floor and the story above are identical. Large, well lighted and ventilated, they are all that might be desired in a most up-to-date hospital. Each is capable of holding twelve beds, but at the present time but ten are placed in position. The beds are simple and comfortable, white enameled steel with springs and the latest sanitary mattresses. Being surrounded on three sides by outside walls in which are set high and generous windows, the wards are assured of a wealth of light and sunshine during the daylight hours, there being no obstruction within several hundred feet.

**Operating Room**  
Perhaps the most interesting room in the building from the visitor's standpoint, as well as from a scientific point of view, is the operating room, located on the top floor and in the end of the building farthest away from Coburg street. The entire end wall is taken up by a large plate glass window, and almost the whole roof is composed of ground glass. The result is a well-distributed soft, though perfect light, assisted by the interior finish of the room which is white tiling and white enamel walls. The artificial lighting is, indeed, furnished by a large electricator, swung from the centre of the ceiling, surrounding the room and opening directly off it are smaller rooms for preparatory work. On the right are the sterilizing and nurses' preparation rooms, with a room for supplies attached. In this will be kept bandages, sponges, splints, towels and other necessaries required during and after operations. Opening off the other side of the operating room are the doctors' preparation rooms, toilet, dressing rooms and shower bath. In

**TO OPEN NEW INFIRMARY TOMORROW**  
Sisters of Charity's Hospital Ready For Its Work  
MODERN IN EVERY WAY

None in Eastern Canada to Excel it—A Description of the Building and Its Equipment—Open To All  
Within a few days the St. John Infirmary, the fine new hospital built by the Sisters of Charity in Coburg street, will be opened for the reception of patients and the final details are now practically completed. The opening of the institution is scheduled for tomorrow afternoon.

A visit to the new infirmary is sufficient to convince one that it is, to the minute detail, as up-to-date as there is in Eastern Canada today. A "Times" representative yesterday had the pleasure of being shown through the building by the general Mother Superior, Sister Mary Fabrice, under whose guidance the institution will be operated and Sister Mary Veronica, who will fill the important position of head nurse.

The Building.  
The building consists of three stories and basement. In the basement are located the heating apparatus, laundry, kitchen, morgue, store rooms and quarters of the janitor. The caretaker's apartment is a comfortable suite of half a dozen rooms with all modern conveniences, is finished in white, which predominates all through this section of the building. The laundry is fitted with a series of small enamel tubs along the outside wall, while the ironing board is erected on one of the other walls. Immediately adjoining the laundry is the drying room, fitted with an efficient steam drier. Into the laundry a linen chute opens, which carries the soiled linen from all floors and does away with the necessity of carrying it to the basement. The store rooms are spacious and fitted with closets and cupboards for the maintenance of all descriptions of stores.

The building is heated by a double hard coal furnace, the heating factor located the heating apparatus, laundry, kitchen, morgue, store rooms and quarters of the janitor. The caretaker's apartment is a comfortable suite of half a dozen rooms with all modern conveniences, is finished in white, which predominates all through this section of the building. The laundry is fitted with a series of small enamel tubs along the outside wall, while the ironing board is erected on one of the other walls. Immediately adjoining the laundry is the drying room, fitted with an efficient steam drier. Into the laundry a linen chute opens, which carries the soiled linen from all floors and does away with the necessity of carrying it to the basement.
