YALE STUDENTS WANT MORE POWER

They Advocate Voluntary Class Attendance and Object to Compulsory Religious Worship.

New Haven, Conn., Feb. 16.-Efforts obtain, more student government at Yale are being continued. Resolutions which were submitted to the College Student Council recently were made bublic, and university publications are giving space to letters and comment on the question of greater freedom for the indergraduates in the academic de-

partment. One resolution advocates a "system of voluntary class attendance," with unimited cuts for undergraduates whose average mark in studies has been above seventy per cent. Another resolution urges the discontinuance of compulsory attendance at religious worship on Sundays, declaring that "such worship is a travesty on ro-licion"

Graduate courses in law will be given in 1924 in the curriculum of the Yale Summer School of Law, open to teachers of law who wish to take courses leading to higher law degrees. John Milton Berdan, an assistant professor in English in Yale College, has been promoted to a full professor-ship. He was graduated from Yale in 1896, and after graduate study, a year abroad, two years teaching in Toledo, O., and an instructorship at Yale, he was made an assistant professor in
