

CIDER WILL BOOM

Provided the Whole Dominion
Adopts Prohibition.

Difference Between What is Now
Proposed and the Scott Act—
Correspondents' Views.

To the Editor of the Planet.
Sir—It is not the deficit in the Dominion treasury that prohibition will cause but the deficit in his own barroom receipts that is worrying the hotelkeeper. He is looking out for himself. Why will not the farmer do the same? Every man with an orchard should not only vote for prohibition but get his neighbors to. Apples to-day are worth from 40 to 75 cents a barrel, while cider is worth only 15 cents a gallon. If prohibition carried and people could not get whiskey and beer they would drink more cider. The statement that prohibition will stop cider making is untrue. It will only prohibit cider with alcohol in it. The success of prohibition will therefore mean that cider, being the principal drink, instead of selling for 15 cents a gallon would be worth 50 or 75 cents and apples would correspondingly advance in price to at least \$2 and \$3 per barrel. Every apple raiser should vote for prohibition and look after his own interests instead of sacrificing them to the welfare of the liquor dealers.

WHY PROHIBITION WILL BE ENFORCED.

Sir—The argument is used that because the Scott Act was a partial failure total prohibition will also be. The same are not analogous. There was no machinery provided in the Scott Act for its enforcement. It was a Dominion act whose really penalty depended on the license acts of the various provinces. But in the case of prohibition any violation will come under the internal revenue or customs. Liquor, if it is in evidence, must either have been smuggled or else made in an illicit distillery in either case those concerned are liable to go to the central prison for the commission of a criminal act. There can be no such humbugging as there was under the Scott Act. Dominion officials will be required to enforce the law against compound liquor the same under prohibition as they are now, and they enforce it pretty thoroughly now.

Because it would be class legislation and would lead to further restrictions on personal liberty.

Because it would require an army of officials if an attempt were made to enforce it, and even then it could not be enforced.
