BY TELEGRAPH TO JOURNAL READING ROOM.

New York, May 6. Nothing special from South. martial law has been proclaimed in Washington. Troops are concentrating on both sides Baltimore, probably soon to throw a strong force into that city, an advance is being made towards Harper's Ferry.

Boston, May 7. Federal troops continue to concentrate in the vicinity of Baltimore. Unionists in Maryland are strongly gaining ground.

Dispatch from the South says proposed attack on Fort Pickens will soon be abandoned, on pretence that troops are wanted further north.

Boston, May 8. Southern dispatches warlike. Forty thousand Federal troops to be immediately concentrated in Washington. Rebels have a force of twenty-five thousand in Virginia, including regiments from Louisiana, Arkansas, Alabama and Tennessee.

Northern States are tendering immense forces to Government. War Department has offers of two hundred and fifty thousand from States west of the Alleghany Mountains. Troops are now volunteering for three years, or during the war.
