In the course of his eloquent discourse, Rev. Father Conway dwelt at length on the dignity of the priesthood. The services were brought to a close with benediction. Today, March 25th, is the Feast of the Annunciation.

## CLOSING COTTON LETTER.

New York, March 25.—The local market opened firm at an advance of from 7 to 10 points on the higher cables and unfavorable weather map. There was active covering by sellers of the earlier week as a result of the unfavorable weather which was expected to continue over Sunday. It was noted that the interests that were active in support of the market a week or two ago did not figure on the buying side. It was considered therefore, that advance was largely the result of the short covering. Wall Street, New Orleans and Memphis were credited with a good volume of buying. The local feeling is that farmers have not been able to make any progress with field work and that the rains reported today and predicted for tomorrow would cause further delay. The market closed stronger, 8 to 10 points up.
