

A branch of the British and Foreign Bible Society was organized in the city this year. The most useful institutions in the city are the fire companies of Halifax, according to this B. of T. publication. These, companies are composed of gentlemen who volunteer to render asistance at fires. Each member provides himself with a leather cap, two or three buckets, canvas bag, etc. all of which have the name of the owner and the device of the company painted thereon. The companies are known as the "Heart and Hand," "Hand and Hand," and the "Sunfire" —the latter being the most acclusive.
