He had been ill of chronic dysentery several months. Was well supplied with stores and medicines, but had a presentiment the attack would prove fatal. At first he was able to ride on a donkey, but soon had to be carried. Arriving at Muilalala, beyond Lake Bemba, in the Bosa country, he said: "Build me a hut to die in." A hut was built by his followers. The first of May he was confined to his bed, and afterward suffered greatly, groaning night and day. The third day he said he was very cold, and requested more grass to be put over the hut. His followers could not speak to or go near him. Kitumbo, the Chief of Bosa, sent flour and beans, and behaved well toward the party. The fourth day Dr. Livingstone was miserable, and died about midnight. Makashoa, a servant, was present.
