FIRST DECISION REVERSED

The appeal by the License Department against the decision of Magistrates Otto and Winn in the charge against Mr. F.J. Hartman of New Hamburg for an alleged infraction of the Ontario Temperance Act was heard before Judge Heald at the Judges' Chambers this morning. At the first trial the action against Mr. Hartman was dismissed.

The evidence was again heard before the Judge. Witnesses examined and cross-examined were defendant, Mr. Hartman, Inspector J. Winterhalt, and Inspector A.E. Sarvis of Toronto, who alleged to have found beer stronger than 24 per cent on the hotel premises. Mr. Sims was the counsel for the defendant and Mr. D.S. Bowkly for the prosecution.

The defendant put up a strong defence. Magistrate Winn and Otto also gave evidence which tended to establish credibility in the evidence of the defendant.

After reviewing all points the Judge decided that the former judgment be reversed. A fine of \$200 was imposed on the defendant.

As to the length of time the refugee work will be carried on, depends entirely upon the demand, at present it is impossible to say how long this will keep up.
