## ASSUMED POST AT INSTITUTION

**PROFESSOR SCHAEFFER BEGINS WORK AT WATERLOO**

Valuable Addition to Educational Forces of the Twin City  
 The Rev. Prof. Henry Schaeffer, B.D., S.T.M., Ph. D., the new professor of the Waterloo College and Seminary arrived here this week and has already entered upon his duties at the Lutheran Seminary, Kitchener people will have a first opportunity to hear Dr. Schaeffer at a Thanksgiving service on Sunday night in St. Matthews church. Altho Dr. Schaeffer is a comparatively young man he has had a very successful career as a scholar and considerable experience as a pastor and as a teacher.

After completing his ministerial training in 1907 he took up a post graduate course in Oriental Languages at the University of Chicago and received in 1908 a traveling scholarship which enabled him to spend a year at the American school for Oriental Study and Research in Jerusalem, Syria. During the summer of 1909 he continued his studies at the University of Heidelberg and in the autumn of the same year entered the University of Pa., receiving in 1912 the degree of Ph. D. in Semitics. He then became a member of the teaching staff of the Episcopal Academy at Philadelphia. In 1915 he assumed the pastorate of Christ church Chestnut Hill, which office he has now relinquished in order to accept a professorship at the Waterloo Seminary.

Dr. Schaeffer has also been active in a literary way. His work on the "Social Legislation of the Primitive Semites" published in 1915 by the Yale University Press and the Oxford University Press has been extensively reviewed by scientific journals in the U.S. and in England. The professor has now almost ready for the press another book entitled "Hebrew Tribalism and the Year of Jubilee as illustrated in Semitic and European village communities."

The Twin-city is to be congratulated on having been able to add to its educational forces a scholar and teacher like Dr. Schaeffer.

But you'll not be sorry. In addition to Fairbanks, pretty little Marjory Daw is in the cast, and Frank Campeau, Lillian Langdon, Sam Sothern of the famous family of stage history, Albert McQuarrie, Jay Dwigins and a lot of others.

Detroit Woman Takes Girl. From West Lorne School. West Lorne, Oct. 9.—West Lorne was the scene of an attempted kidnapping yesterday, and the sequel to day in court has aroused much interest.

Mrs. Gertrude Mead, about five years ago, gave her four-year-old daughter to Mr. James Toles, of Aldborough Township, south of here on an agreement that he was to keep and bring up the child as his own. She came here from Detroit, where she has been living on No. 32 M. C. R. yesterday, arriving soon after 11 a.m. and went to the public school, where she got possession of the girl and took her back to the railway station with a view to returning to Detroit on the noon westbound.

The school-teacher has suspicions over the cause of her charge's disappearance, however, and failing to recover the child, sent for the constable, who took the girl from Mrs. Mead and placed the woman under arrest.

She was brought before Squire Hunt at Rodney to-day and convicted of unlawfully attempting to detain a child under the age of 14 from his foster-parents. The county magistrate released her on suspended sentence on furnishing securities of \$200.
