BILL.

An Act to make more ample provision for the incorporation of the Town of St. Hyacinthe, and to extend its limits.

WHEREAS the present limits of the Town of St. Hyacinthe are not of sufficient extent, and it has become necessary to make better provision for its internal government, and to enable the Council of the said Town to lay out larger sums of money than they have hitherto done for the improvement of the said Town; Be it therefore enacted, &c.,

Preamble.

That the Act passed in the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty's Reign, chaptered one hundred and five, and intituled, "*An Act to provide more fully for the incorporation of the Village of St. Hyacinthe,*" is hereby repealed; and the inhabitants of the Town of St. Hyacinthe, within the limits hereinafter prescribed, and their successors, shall be and are hereby declared to be a body politic and corporate, in fact and in law, by the name of "The Mayor and Town Council of St. Hyacinthe," and by the same name they and their successors shall have perpetual succession, and shall have power to sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, answer and be answered unto, in all Courts, and in all actions, causes, and suits at law whatsoever, and shall have a common seal, with power to alter and modify the same at their will and pleasure; and shall be in law capable of receiving by donation, acquiring, holding, and departing with any property, real or moveable, for the use of the said Town; of becoming parties to any contracts or agreements in the management of the affairs of the said Town; and of giving or accepting any notes, bonds, obligations, judgments, or other instruments or securities, for the payment or for securing the payment of any sum of money borrowed or loaned, or for the execution, or for guaranteeing the execution of any duty, right or thing whatsoever.

The Inhabitants of the Town of St. Hyacinthe declared a body corporate.

II. And be it enacted, That the said Town of St. Hyacinthe shall be bounded as follows, to wit:—In front, towards the South-east, by a line running along the centre of the River Yamaska; on one side, towards the North-east, by a line dividing the land of the Corporation of the Seminary of St. Antoine from that of Antoine Charron dit Cabana; on the other side, towards the South-west,
