Description for patent

All that parcel of land situate in the Paskonkin Indian reserve, in the District of Rainy River, Province of Ontario and Dominion of Canada, containing by admeasurement twenty-seven acres and eighty-five hundredths of an acre, more or less, being composed of that parcel or property known as the Lighthouse site, together with the road allowance through the Morriseau Claim, which may be more particularly described as follows,—

Commencing at a point on the North boundary of the Paskonkin Indian reserve distant twenty-five chains West of the North East corner of the Michel Morriseau Claim; thence South along the West boundary of said Claim sixteen chains; thence West seventeen chains, more or less, to the shore of Rainy River; thence northerly along the shore of Rainy River to the North boundary of the Paskonkin Indian reserve; thence East along the said North boundary fourteen chains and fifty links, more or less, to the place of beginning, containing by admeasurement twenty-four acres and eight-tenths of an acre, more or less, together with a roadway from the Lighthouse reserve to the East shore of Rainy River, which road has a perpendicular width of one chain and extends
