## SUMMARY OF EVENTS:

- Dec. 1 The total strength of the Station, 568, resumed training.
- Dec. 2 Commission Board for purpose of selecting commission material from Course No. 38. Water from main building to Medical Selection Building completed.
- Dec. 3 Selection Board for Course No. 38: 21 Observers and 104 Pilots. S/Ldr o Farrell from No. 1 Training Command attended.
- Dec. 4 Barber shop started. Course No. 38 completed.
