 - (a) Courses
 - (1) A two weeks' course in the use of gridded oblique air photographs for artillery spotting began 1st Soptember at Petawawa. Vacancies were allotted as follows:-

(1) 4th Division

The strength was 671 (673) Officers, and 13,723 (13,619) Other Ranks; wanted to complete establishment, 128 (126) Officers and 3,045 (3,147) Other Ranks. The number required to complete establishment includes 58 Officers and 1,471 Other Ranks of Artillery Units not yet authorized to mobilize.

(11) 5th (Armoured) Division

The strength was 704 (691) Officers and 12,831 (12,906) Other Ranks; wanted to complete establishment, 39 (52) Officers and 1,102 (1,027) Other Ranks.
