Q-193 That is the only company you were in in A-10?

A-193 Yes, sir.

Q-194 How did you get along?

A-194 I got along just fine, sir.

Q-195 Were there any exceptions to that?

A-195 No, sir.

Q-196 No trouble at all?

A-196 No trouble at all, sir.
