COMPANY COMMANDER'S REPORT: This man was forwarded to this unit for early despatch
 to C.A.O. - his present DCM sentence to be remitted
 one day after sailing. Low M rating precluded inclusion in draft. Nothing
 known of general attitude. M.F.M. 6 shows many crimes - apparently badly ad-

ARMY EXAMINER'S REPORT: Enlisted 7/April/42. He has been convicted of two
 civil charges serving five months in civil jail. He has forfeited a
 total of 144 days pay since he entered the army. He never attended school. His
 parents parted when he was 2 months old. He was adopted by Mrs. Margaret Welsh,
 East Mapleton, N.S. and lived over six miles from the nearest school. Mrs. Welsh
 was unable to read or write herself. This man is unable to read or write, or even
 to sign his name. By tests used in this interview it would appear that his I.Q.
 is under 60. At the time of attestation he was enlisted by making his mark. In
 view of the above evidence of low mental ability and stability it seems he should
 be graded M.4 S.4. His value to the army is very problematical. He is at pre-
 sent in #70 Mil. Det. Barracks. H. I. Boyd, Lieut. A. E.

PERSONAL HISTORY: Born 29/Mar/22. Healthy childhood and no neurotic tendencies.
 He has had no schooling. He was helper on farm till enlist-
 ment. His habits have been normal and interests few. No crimes in civil life.
 Army History:- Enlisted 7/April/42. Completed Basic and Advanced training
 in Detention. Barracks. A.W.L. twice.

EXAMINATION: A pleasant co-operative young U.S. soldier well motivated.
 He has no somatic complaints. There are no signs or symp-
 toms of autonomic instability. Judgement fair. General knowledge poor, concept
 tests are fair. He rates about 10 year old level of intelligence. He is com-
 pletely illiterate.

IMPRESSION: A mentally retarded, illiterate with no evidence of insta-
 bility. If he is of no use to the army, recommend con-
 sideration of discharge under C.A.R.O. 1029(12).
