Gentlemen:

Re your letter of March 3rd, it is very difficult to estimate the timber remaining on I.R. 13 as we have no idea what the demand for lumber will be in the next year or so. As outlined in previous letters, we were able to take off a large amount of saw logs from this area of a low grade quality due to the extreme demand for logs during the war. In ordinary times there would be no demand for this type of timber.

However, if the demand for lumber keeps up, we may possibly estimate one million feet of small low grade scattered timber suitable for cutting in a small mill.
