a half feet would, I believe, be sufficient to divert most of the river; it would give a depth of from four to five feet on the crest of the bar. The cost would be from \$50 to \$100 depending upon the size of the gravel beneath the surface and whether logs are encountered. Much too will depend on the man directing the work, an incompetent man could easily ruin the whole business.

I interviewed the Provincial Road Inspector on this subject and he promised to close Jacobson's slough as much as possible in order to save his bridges.

The cost of this service was \$50 voucher for which will be forwarded in due course.
