VIRTUE is an honorable and an extensive name. it is confined to no one particular fituation in life; but it finnes with peculiar amiableness and lustre when in an elevated station. How severely does the character of our late wife and brave General reptove those who because they are in the high walks of life, think they are above the practice of virtue, or the performances of the christian duties of the fanctuary or of the closet.

A fecond characterestic of Major General Brock, whole wisdom rendered him so eminently suitable for the high and honorable station which he filled, was his liberality.

RELIGIOUS bigotry is a quality of a little mind. The General poffeffing liberality of fentiment in fo eminent a degree, united with an ardent defire to fee the interest of religion and morality increased, that I had almost put on the the air of a prophet, and laying aside my usual diffidence as to things in futurity, was about to predict a most favorable
