CLARENCEVILLE.

A pretty little village in the parish of St. Georges de Clarenceville. It is situated in the midst of a rich farming country, about mid-way between the Richelieu River and Missisquoi Bay, the nearest railway station is Lacolle, 5 miles distant. The Canada Atlantic Railway when completed will have a station within two miles. For many years the passage of the Richelieu River was made by ferry, but in 1882, the Richelieu Bridge Company was organized and incorporated through the exertions of Wm. M. Pattison, Esq., A. H. Derick, Esq., and a few others, and work commenced on an iron bridge, which was completed and opened to the public May 9th, 1884. A. H. Derick and Wm. M. Pattison have also formed a partnership and put up a private telephone under the name of the Clarenceville Telephone Company, connecting the Custom House, Post-office, Richelieu Bridge and Lacolle station. There are four churches in Clarenceville, English, Baptist, Methodist and Roman Catholic, also two temperance hotels, telephone and telegraph offices, a carriage factory, &c. Mail daily. It is also a distributing office to Aird, Nutt's Corners, Wolfe Ridge and Miranda tri-weekly. Population 300.
