GRAMMAR SCHOOLS.

Each of these schools (which form the intermediate link between the Common Schools and the Universities) is managed by a Board of Trustees, appointed jointly by the County and Town Councils. In cities the Trustees are all appointed by the City Council, except where there is only one school in the county. The head master must be a graduate of a British or Colonial University, unless certificated and appointed by the 18th September, 1865. Besides fees, local rates or contributions to the extent of half the Government grant must be raised for the master's salary. The grant is payable to those schools only which attain a certain standard, and is based on the average attendance of pupils in the prescribed studies. An extra grant is provided for masters taking certain meteorological observations, and giving military instruction. Pupils attending these schools are prepared for matriculation in the Universities.
