

#### Best way to Make Ice Cream.

Where cream alone is used in making ice cream one-half or one third of the quantity used should be scalded, the sugar dissolved in the scalded portion, and when cool added to the remaining quantity of cream. Where cream is not obtainable, milk may be used enriched by the yolks of eggs, allowing four to each quart of milk. Scald the milk in a double boiler, beat the eggs and sugar together; add to the hot milk, for a moment, and then strain into the ice cream mould and freeze.—June Ladies' Home Journal
