A Bill to explain and amend an Act, relating to partition of Lands in Coparcenary, joint Tenancy, &c. And also,

A Bill to revive and continue an Act, for regulating and maintaining a Light House at the Entrance of the Harbour of Shelburne, were severally read a second Time.

*Resolved*, That the Bills be now committed to a Committee of the whole House, and thereupon the House *resolved* itself into a Committee of the whole House, on the said Bills accordingly.

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair,

The Chairman *reported* from the Committee, that they had gone through the Bills, and had directed him to report them severally to the House without any Amendment, and he afterwards delivered the Bills in at the Clerk's Table.

*Ordered*, That the Bills be engrossed.

Mr. Starns pursuant to leave given, presented a Bill, to prevent the clandestine and illegal Importation of Goods liable to Duties by the Laws of this Province, and the same was read a first Time.

*Resolved*, That the Bill be now read a second Time, and the same was read accordingly.

*Resolved*, That the Bill be now committed to a Committee of the whole House, and thereupon the House *resolved* itself into a Committee of the whole House on the said Bill accordingly.

An engrossed Bill to revive and continue an Act for the regulating and maintaining a Light House at the Entrance of the Harbour of Shelburne, was read the third Time.

*Resolved*, That the Bill do pass, and that the title be an Act. to revive and continue an Act passed in the 33 Year of the Reign of his present Majesty, intitled an Act, in Amendment of, and in Addition to an Act, made in the 33d Year of the Reign of his late Majesty, intitled an Act for regulating and maintaining a Light House on Sambro-Island, and in Addition to, and Amendment of an Act, passed in the Twenty-Eight Year of his present Majesty's Reign, intitled an Act for regulating and maintaining a Light House at the Entrance of the Harbour of Shelburne.

*Ordered*, That the Clerk do carry the said Bills to the Council, and desire their Concurrence to the same.
