The House according to the order of the day, resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House, on the Bill, "to prohibit the practice of drifting for "fish in this Province."

Mr. M'Kay, from the Committee, reported that they had gone thro' the Bill, and had agreed to the same with amendments.
