Fourth Parliament. C.4. In the forty-fixth year of George the Third, A. D. 1806.

Districts aforesaid, in such manner, and under such regulations, as are hereinafter enacted.

III. And be it further Enatted by the Authority aforefaid, That the faid sum of one thousand six hundred pounds, shall be disposed of in manner sollowing : to the Eastern District the sum of two hundred pounds, to the District of Johnstown the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds, to the Midland District the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds, to the District of Newcastle the sum of two hundred pounds, to the Home District the sum of two hundred pounds, to the District of Niagara the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds, to the District of London the sum of three hundred pounds, and to the Western District the sum of two hundred and fifty pounds.

The manner in which the faid fum of one thousand fix hundred pounds shall be disposed

IV. And be it further Enatled by the Authority aforesaid, That the Treasurer of each and every District in this Province, shall receive the sum of money apportioned by this Act, and shall pay the same to such person or persons as the Justices of the Peace in General Quarter Sessions assembled, or the majority of them, shall order, which sum of money in each and every District as aforesaid, shall be laid out and applied for the improvement of the Public Highways leading throughout this Province, from the Eastern to the Western appoint, to be District; in such manner as the said Justices of the Peace in Quarter Sessions said Quarter affembled, or the majority of them shall limit and appoint.

TreaTurer of each diftrict shall receive the money apportioned to his district, and pay the fame to fuch persons as the Quarter Seffions shall applied as the Sessions shall direct.

V. And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That each and every Treasurer as aforesaid, shall give Bonds for the due discharge of the trust vested in him by this Act, in the same manner that security is given for the money Treasurers for received from the District rates, and each and every Treasurer as asoresaid, monies receivshall and may retain in proportion to three pounds, on every one hundred pounds by him received and paid out as aforesaid, as a compensation for his fervices.

VI. And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That the Road Road which which shall be deemed the Public Highway throughout this Province, as far as the public high? the fame extends, through the Diffrict of London shall be as follows, namely way through the diffrix of commencing at the Indian Mill on the Grand River, thence along the Road London. leading through the Township of Burford to the Delaware Town, on the River Thames, and across the said River, thence down the River to the tract of Land commonly called the Moravian Grant,

VII. And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That the monies hereby granted to his Majesty shall be paid by the Receiver General in discharge of such warrant or warrants, as shall for the purposes herein before set Governor, &c. forth, be from time to time issued by the Governor Lieutenant-Governor, or rants. person Administering the Government of this Province, and not otherwise, and the faid Receiver General shall account to his Majesty, his Heirs and Such neral to account ceffors for the same, through the Lords Commissioners of his Majesty's Treafury for the time being, in such manner and form as his Majesty his Heirs and Successors shall be graciously pleased to direct.
